## A Year in Review: Wow, 2017 was a busy and blessed year at St. Mary Anne's! God was good and faithful to our parish. Let's look at some highlights...

- During late January and February, we participated in the Rotating Homeless Shelter. For two weeks, we organized meals in our Parish Center and provided volunteers to staff the shelter.
- We re-established the 2:42 Men's Group; began Women's Fellowship Circles and a Cemetery Committee.
- We provided education to our parishioners by co-sponsoring Managing Senior Life Workshops; had a 4-part Lenten education program on Faith & Science; and studied The Book of Acts.
- We evaluated our sacred graveyard and learned preservation techniques to straighten and clean the gravestones. A team of dedicated volunteers are now hard at work to preserve this sacred space.
- In early April, we celebrated a parish-wide wedding and reception for Amanda & Jon. Days later, Amanda underwent complex brain surgery. She has had a phenomenal recovery. God is good, indeed!
- Holy Week was a sacred journey. We provided many opportunities to worship as we prepared to celebrate
  the Resurrection on a beautiful Easter Sunday.
- Our 20th Annual Garden Market blossomed in early May. Thousands of visitors walked through our gates, purchased flowers and plants from a variety of vendors, ate delectable food, and even had the opportunity to ring our historic church bell!
- Bishop Santosh Marray made his annual visit in June. While here, he baptized and confirmed both babies and adults.
- Six baptisms this year!
- Our Annual Church Picnic was held on a picture-perfect summer day! Grilling and delicious picnic food, fellowship, and kayaking made this annual event memorable.
- Six days a week, our Parish Center is an active meeting place for 3 recovery support groups (N/A, A/A and Al Anon), Scouts, 4-H, a chess club, a senior group, and a civic gardening club. This high usage area needed some renovations, so this year we completely remodeled our Parish Hall and kitchen, front and rear lobbies, and restrooms. We installed a new roof over the kitchen, ductless heating/air-conditioning units, new ceiling tiles, new flooring, paint, countertops, dishwasher, fridge, sinks, vanities, toilets and plumbing fixtures. A new audio-visual system was gifted and installed as well. This work was funded by a grant and a combination of memorials, financial gifts and donations, along with hundred's of hours of volunteer labor.
- A "Dream Big" Scholarship, initially funded by a financial gift from the Flood family, has been established. Graduating high school seniors, who are active members of this parish, are eligible to apply.
- Our Church School is growing with children, with lessons for kindergarten through grade 8.
- Two members of our Youth Group journeyed to Oklahoma this July to participate in EYE (Episcopal Youth Event).
- The 1st Annual Men's Chili Cook-off, in November, raised over \$1400.00 for Hurricane Maria victims in Puerto Rico.
- In the fall, our ECW sponsored a Mystery Trip Bus Trip to the Eastern Shore. More than 50+ parishioners and friends participated in this fellowship adventure.

- Our Gingerbread float in the Cecil County Christmas Parade won 1st Place in the Non-profit category!
- Our 2nd Annual Christmas Cookie Walk was a huge success! From our estimates, we sold approximately 270lbs of homemade cookies!
- Our 2nd Annual Wreaths Across America was held this month. Following a moving tribute ceremony, wreaths were laid on over 70 veterans' graves in our grave yard.
- Our Giving Tree Project has brightened the lives of many needy children this year. Our parishioners donated 66 boxes of Christmas gifts to local school children.
- Dennis and Jacob joined our Choir. You can hear our lovely Choir sing every Sunday morning at 10:00AM!
- Our music program, led by our Director of Music Steve McBride, was also enhanced by guest musicians and concerts. First, the glorious Requiem concert prepared us for Holy Week. A brass quintet joined us on Easter. And a handbell concert rung in the Christmas season!
- Victoria Robertson, professional vocalist and daughter of parishioners Sheila & Gordon Robertson, gave a
  delightful summer concert in our sanctuary; soloed at our Christmas Eve Services and with Steve, headlined
  the entertaining Songs of Joy!! Christmas Concert.
- Our sweet parish children participated in the yearly Christmas Pageant under the direction of Rachelan Griffin. A week later, generations of female parishioners gave a moving Voices of Mary presentation during our Sunday Services.
- We raised awareness about the problems of addiction in our community at our first National Overdose Awareness Church Service in late August. Guest speakers provided valuable information and testimony.
- We began a monthly 12-Step Recovery Church service this month. Future ones will be held on the 2nd Sunday of the month at 6:00PM. This service is designed to strengthen those in recovery with the message of hope, redemption, and God's grace.
- Our Mission Committee participates in two major fundraising endeavors: Train Day in January and the Duck Races at our Garden Market. Each year, they distribute Mission funds (approximately \$33,000+) to local, national and international charities and ministries.
- Three days a week, year long, our Outreach volunteers provide bags of food to the hungry. In the past 12 months, they helped 1,207 families and 3,657 individuals, as they distributed 5,992 bags of SMA food and 1,509 bags of federal food!
- Our Pastoral Care team visits infirmed parishioners in hospitals, nursing homes and the homebound. They
  provide food, companionship and Communion. They are angels in our midst.
